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## Finding a Community-Engaged Course

## **Using Attributes**

A community-engaged course is a course that collaborates with a community partner in a reciprocal and mutually beneficial way. Some courses are designated as community-engaged in the online schedule of classes. These classes will automatically count towards your Community Engagement for the Public Good Certificate. To find a community-engaged course in the online schedule of classes, follow these steps!



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To begin looking for class offerings, you must first select the term you want to view. Make sure you choose the correct term and year.

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## Identifying a Community-Engaged Course

A community-engaged course is a course that collaborates with a community partner in a reciprocal and mutually beneficial way. Not all community-engaged courses have the community engaged attribute in the online schedule of classes.
