The Path Forward Program

AY 2023-24

[The Path Forward Program](#) provides support to eligible first-time, first-year students in their academic journeys as they transition into their second year and beyond. Students in the program create individualized plans to succeed at DU by connecting with resources and reaching milestones in their academic journeys.

Program participants commit to completing the following steps:

- Meet with their academic advisor in winter and spring 2024 before registration for upcoming quarters
- Register for 12+ credits for spring 2024 and fall 2024 during registration week (before end of week 9 of each quarter)
- Fill out required financial aid application forms (FAFSA and CSS Profile) by March 15th.
- Meet with a [student success coach](#) at least once to enhance skills and tools for success at DU and learn more about resources available to DU students. In addition to the meeting with a student success coach, either schedule a follow-up meeting with a coach or meet the requirement by:
 - o Meeting with a [Career Advisor](#)
 - o If undeclared, meeting with [an advisor in a potential major](#)
 - o Attending 8 out of 10 weekly meetings, if enrolled in the [Learning Effectiveness Program](#)
 - o Submitting a meeting proposal to studentsuccess@du.edu for approval

Students who successfully complete the Path Forward Program will be eligible for:

- Priority housing selection for their second year, meaning they will have the opportunity to have an earlier timeslot to select their housing. All the students in their roommate group will get the same timeslot. In order to be eligible for priority housing, students must complete winter criteria by March 29th. Only the first 150 students to complete the listed criteria will be eligible.
- A need-based Path Forward Grant of up to \$2,500 to be awarded for the following academic year. Determined based on financial need (FAFSA and CSS profiles).
- A completion prize from the DU Bookstore and entry in the Path Forward raffle.

Path Forward Program Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Who is eligible for this program?

A: First-time, first-year undergraduate students who started at DU in fall 2023, who have not yet declared a major or are identified by the university as potential beneficiaries of additional academic support to assist with a successful transition from first to second year. Eligible students will receive an email invitation to join the program.

Q: What happens after I join the program?

A: You'll receive an invitation to the Path Forward Canvas course, where you'll find all the details about the program. Please read the homepage of the course and complete the registration survey. You'll receive reminders through Canvas about upcoming opportunities and deadlines related to the program steps.

Q: How much of a time commitment is the Path Forward Program?

A: Almost all program requirements are things you'll already complete throughout the academic year, like registering for the following quarter and meeting with your advisor. Therefore, the Path Forward Program requires very little additional time. In fact, you can expect the only additional time commitment to be your quarterly meeting with a Student Success Coach (or another approved individual or office) and the time spent telling us who you met with via a short Canvas survey.

Q: Do I have to complete the Path Forward program requirements in order?

A: No. Several of the requirements have deadlines, but you do not need to wait to complete one requirement before moving on to the next one.

Q: What is the deadline for registration during registration week?

A: Students must register for 12+ credits before the end of week 9 in each term. Hint: We recommend registering during registration week and not waiting until week 9!

Q: What if I have a hold and cannot register during registration week?

A: Please work with your academic advisor before registration week to ensure your holds are cleared. You can find your assigned academic advisor [here](#). If you cannot register due to holds, please contact the student success team through the Path Forward Canvas course to assist with this.

Q: What are student success coaches?

A: Coaching is used by leaders around the world to develop personally and professionally. One of many benefits of being a student at DU is the opportunity to participate in free Student Success Coaching, a resource introduced to DU students early in their academic career so they can take advantage of it throughout their time at the university. Student success coaches provide undergraduate students with one-on-one opportunities to build skills that support your success at DU. Topics are customized to fit your needs and include the following: goal setting, time management & organization, learning styles & strategies, study skills, test anxiety, major/minor exploration, connecting with campus resources, community building, growth mindset & resiliency, stress management & self-care, and emotional intelligence. Q: What do I need to do for my financial aid application?

A: Steps to applying for financial aid can be found [online](#) or on the [2024-25 Financial Aid Application Checklist](#). If you have questions about financial aid, please contact finaid@du.edu. Please note that we expect extended processing times due to the [2024-25 FAFSA changes](#). We recommend giving yourself extra time to complete your financial aid application in order to meet the deadline but are also prepared to provide flexibility on this requirement, while you and your support network navigate the financial aid process.

Q: What if my family doesn't need to/want to complete the FAFSA and CSS profiles?

A: If you and your family decide you do not need to/want to complete the FAFSA and CSS profiles, you can opt-out of this requirement. Please login to Canvas and submit the assignment letting us know you are opting out of the financial aid requirement. Please note, however, that if our records indicate you would benefit financially from completing these profiles, we will reach out and encourage you to do so.

Q: What is priority housing selection?

A: Students with priority housing selection will have an earlier timeslot to select their housing. All the students in your roommate group will get the same timeslot. Additionally, all students and applicable roommates must Fully Complete their housing application by the Housing Priority Deadline of April 2, 2024. How will I know if my application is Fully Complete? You will receive a confirmation email to your DU email and your Application Status Page in the Housing Application will say, "Your application is Fully Complete."

Q: How do I become eligible for priority housing selection in my second year?

A: In order to be eligible for priority housing, students must complete their FAFSA and CSS profiles by March 15th and meet with their advisor regarding spring registration, register for 12+ credits in the spring quarter, and meet with a person or office to expand their constellation of mentors by March 29th. Only the first 150 students to complete the listed criteria will be eligible.

Q: How can I get a Path Forward Grant?

A: The Path Forward Grant of up to \$2,500 may be awarded for the 2024-25 academic year to students with high financial need based on their financial aid applications (FAFSA and CSS Profile) and federal, state, and institutional aid offers. Students must [fill out their FAFSA and CSS Profile](#) by March 15th so Financial Aid can determine eligibility for the grant.

Q: When will I find out if I received a Path Forward Grant?

A: Current DU students that have completed all financial aid application requirements and are eligible for the grant will see the grant listed on their financial aid offer, which is typically received mid-summer.

Q: What is the difference between the Path Forward Program and the Learning Effectiveness Program?

A: While many of the benefits of completing the Path Forward Program and meeting regularly with an LEP advisor are similar – creating connections on campus, accountability, academic and career planning, etc. – the Path Forward Program pairs these behaviors with financial incentives and offers opportunities for students to expand their constellation of mentors at DU. Students enrolled in LEP can count their winter or spring quarter weekly meetings with an LEP advisor toward the Path Forward Program requirements.

Q: I won't be taking courses at DU in fall 2024. Can I still receive the Path Forward Grant in a later quarter?

A: Students must enroll in fall 2024 to be eligible for the Path Forward Grant.

Q: I didn't get an invite to this program. Can I still participate?

A: The Path Forward Program is only available to eligible first-year undergraduate students who received an invitation from the Office of Student Success. However, we encourage all undergraduate DU students to take advantage of the Student Success Coaching program, to meet with their academic advisor, to engage with the 4D experience, and to register during registration week. The grant is only available to eligible traditional undergraduate first-time first-year students.

Q: I'm a student in the Bachelor of Arts Completion Program. Can I join the Path Forward Program?

A: The scholarship and grant are only available to eligible traditional undergraduate first-time first-year students.
